Mission

The ETC Cooperative is committed to supporting community, development, and marketing efforts within the Ethereum Classic ecosystem. Our goal is simply to make ETC better by removing pain points and obstacles that interfere with ETC's current and future users. We aim to help anywhere (i) tools are not up to snuff, (ii) information is lacking, or (iii) awareness of ETC's value is not known.

Many aspects of the ETC Cooperative's operations have significant overlap; for example, improvements to development are often improvements for the community. To better present our efforts over the past 6 months we have divided them into:

- "Technical Enhancements" Providing the end-user tools and technical information that is necessary to use ETC.
- "Community Building" Providing the information and resources that community members expect.
- "Outreach" Reaching out to other cryptocurrency communities to expand ETC's reach.



Accomplishments

To better serve the community, we are releasing biannual reviews of our efforts every 6 months. This document represents the second such review and covers the period of July to December 2018.

These past 6 months have seen a moderate inflow of interest into Ethereum Classic, and sustained growth of the ETC community.

- Our subreddit (/r/ethereumclassic) has grown by 4,000 subscribers.
- The largest ETC Twitter account (@eth_classic) has added on 26,000 followers.
- Average transactions have stayed steady at ~42,000 transactions per day.

ETC Cooperative itself has made many strides, including:

- Successfully becoming a 501 (c)(3) non-profit in November 2018.
- Awareness campaigns, articles, and mailing lists to provide more information to both new and existing users.
- Assisted with managing major events including a reorg attack, and a <u>parity consensus issue</u>.
- Getting ETC in Google's BigQuery so that data scientists can better analyze ETC's network and transactions.
- Launching services for users & developers including free RPC nodes, and a new PoA testnet.
- Substantial efforts to reach out to the Ethereum community, growing acceptance and understanding between the chains.
- Receiving a notable contribution from Ethereum Foundation.

Dev Guides & HOWTOs

We've been writing several guides and other documentation for onboarding users and developers. We've completed the ETC technical guide, written our first guide on deploying ETC smart contracts, and started teaching developers how to use ETC on a Raspberry Pi for loT.

Deployed ETC network to Google Cloud Platform to be stored in Google BigQuery.

Released an extensive guide for querying ETC on Google BigQuery, along with Github repositories.

Deployed ETC network to Kaggle to be used as a dataset by the data science community.

Built a decentralization-measuring Python module to accompany the Kaggle analysis for ETC.

Project Goerli/Kotti

\$125,000

ETC Cooperative was the first group to provide much needed funding to Project Goerli/Kotti and is happy to see the project start to mature.

This project enables us to have a reliable PoA testnet to make many developer's workflows much easier and more productive.

We're also very happy to have supported and built relationships with many ETH developers through this project and our other efforts.

peaceBridge

\$42,480

peaceBridge is a project co-funded by both ETC Cooperative and Ethereum Foundation. Once completed this project will support better interoperability between ETC and ETH chains.

This is done by allowing people to wrap up their ETC and ETH and essentially move it to the other chain.

Long term this project should allow for exchange to occur between any two EVM-based chain.
